

The Brillion Housing Authority manages the Heritage Apartment and is an income-based housing community specifically for individuals aged 55 and older, as well as disabled persons of any age. This 24-unit community, including 1- and 2-bedroom units, offers safe, comfortable, and affordable living with supportive amenities designed to meet the needs of seniors and individuals with disabilities. Rent is based on income, helping residents maintain independence and stability in a caring environment.

What is Income?

Annual income includes all money received on a regular monthly basis, such as, but not limited to:

- Wages
- Social Security Income
- Interest income from investments (Money Market, CD, stocks, bonds) not the principal amount of investment
- If property is owned and rented out, the rental income is included

How is rent calculated?

Rent is calculated based on 30% percent of the gross income. Once an applicant has been determined to be income eligible, (meets the income limits) it is then determined what deductions might apply.

Waiting List

Applications from eligible households will be placed on the waiting list as of the date and time the completed application is received. Length of wait will vary. Applicants will be notified should they not pass the background screening.

Applicants are responsible for notifying the Housing Authority of any changes contact information (i.e. mailing address, phone numbers) or family composition during the wait.

Offer of housing

Once a unit becomes available, Applicant will be asked to verify income, assets, medical expenses, childcare expenses, etc.

Bring any of the following information that applies:

- Copy of your most recent Social Security award letter.
- Most current pay stubs from employer or other income source including pensions and IRAs.
- Listing of all assets including bank statements, stocks, bonds, mutual funds or other investments.
- Senior citizens or disabled persons should bring documentation of any ongoing out-of-pocket medical expenses including medical insurance.
- Family applicants should bring documentation of child care providers.
